If you wish to transfer your permitted facility, you must notify the District within 30 days of any sale, conveyance or other transfer of a permitted system or facility, or within 30 days of any change in ownership or control of the real property (or project or activity) where the permitted system or facility is located. You will need to provide the District with the information specified in Rule 62-330.340, Florida Administrative Code (name and address of the transferee and a copy of the instrument effectuating the transfer). Please note that a permittee remains jointly and severally liable with the new owner for any corrective actions that may be required as a result of any permit violations that occur before the permit is transferred, so it is recommended that you request a permit transfer promptly to reduce your potential liability.

CONDITIONS FOR ISSUANCE OF PERMIT NUMBER 96559-13
The Villages of Valencia Phase 2
PERMIT TRANSFER ISSUED July 28, 2015

1. All activities shall be implemented as set forth in the plans, specifications and performance criteria as approved by this permit. Any deviation from the permitted activity and the conditions for undertaking that activity shall constitute a violation of this permit.
2. Activities approved by this permit shall be conducted in a manner which do not cause violations of state water quality standards.
3. Should any other regulatory agency require changes to the permitted system, the permittee shall provide written notification to the District of the changes prior implementation so that a determination can be made whether a permit modification is required.
4. This permit does not eliminate the necessity to obtain any required federal, state, local and special district authorizations prior to the start of any activity approved by this permit. This permit does not convey to the permittee or create in the permittee any property right, or any interest in real property, nor does it authorize any entrance upon or activities on property which is not owned or controlled by the permittee, or convey any rights or privileges other than those specified in the permit and chapter 40C-4 or chapter 40C-40, F.A.C.
5. The permittee shall hold and save the District harmless from any and all damages, claims, or liabilities which may arise by reason of the activities authorized by the permit or any use of the permitted system.
6. The permittee shall notify the District in writing within 30 days of any sale, conveyance, or other transfer of ownership or control of the permitted system or the real property at which the permitted system is located. All transfers of ownership or transfers of a permit are subject to the requirements of rule 40C-1.612, F.A.C. The permittee transferring the permit shall remain liable for any corrective actions that may be required as a result of any permit violations prior to such sale, conveyance or other transfer.
7. Upon reasonable notice to the permittee, District authorized staff with proper identification shall have permission to enter, inspect, sample and test the system to insure conformity with the plans and specifications approved by the permit.
8. The proposed surface water management system must be constructed, operated, and maintained in accordance with the plans received by the District on April 18, 2006, and as amended by plans received by the District on May 2, 2006, May 8, 2006, and May 25, 2006..
9. The operation and maintenance entity shall inspect the stormwater or surface water management system once within two years after the completion of construction and every two years thereafter to determine if the system is functioning as designed and permitted. The operation and maintenance entity must maintain a record of each required inspection, including the date of the inspection, the name and contact information of the inspector, and whether the system was functioning as designed and permitted, and make such record available for inspection upon request by the District during normal business hours.

If at any time the system is not functioning as designed and permitted, then within 14 days of that inspection the entity shall submit a report electronically or in writing to the District using Form 62-330.311(1), "Operation and Maintenance Inspection certification," (<http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-02502>) describing the remedial actions taken to resolve the failure or deviation.
